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

#### Chloe Gosselin gathered ankle boots




#### *At the 2017 Academy Awards in Givenchy Haute Couture*

#### At the 'The Favourite' London Film Festival Premiere in Louis Vuitton




#### Gemma Chan in Jason Wu Collection at the Critics Choice Awards

# Golden Bridge Round 39 makes an ideal gift for Valentine's Day



When the most famous calibre in watchmaking is adorned with High Jewellery lacework gem setting, the result sheds new light on the architecture of the baguette movement.

It will soon be 40 years old. But the best is yet to come. Beyond its men's and women's models, its manual or automatic winding, its vertical or horizontal structure, there is still no shortage of pages left to be written about the baguette movement. The Golden Bridge Round 39 is a perfect example.

It is probably one of the most daring High Jewellery creations, not only for Corum but for contemporary watchmaking. The Golden Bridge Round 39's unique architecture features an exquisite interplay of shapes with its horizontal baguette movement and a half-moon on each side

of a round 39 mm case. No fewer than six new High Jewellery versions are being unveiled today. Together, they highlight five exceptional stones: diamond, sapphire, ruby, tsavorite and amethyst. These stones are set in a genuine gold lacework that extends across the movement. Unlike most jewellery creations, with the Golden Bridge Round 39, light thus comes from within the piece. It illuminates the movement with glints of blue, green, red, purple and white. The baguette movement is the central element and core identity of any Golden Bridge, and the entire composition of the Round 39 model has been designed to showcase it once again.

To do so, a lacework microstructure has been stretched out alongside the movement, which is home to gem setting requiring a day and a half of work. To accentuate the dial's radiance, Corum's artisans have chosen a marquise cut for the stones, giving the impression that rays of light are emanating from the movement and radiating out toward the case. Finally, the openwork character of the jewellery lacework allows light to literally cross through the piece. Each stone sparkles differently, depending on the angle, nature and intensity of the light that is cast on it, meaning that the Golden Bridge Round 39 never looks quite the same throughout the day.

As with any High Jewellery piece, the Golden Bridge Round 39, offered in white gold and pink gold, is entirely paved (dial, bezel and horns). The diamond version has a final particularity: the two gold bridges that frame its baguette movement are paved with diamonds, as is the flange. These versions feature 76 Wesselton diamonds on the case, 12 marquise-cut diamonds and 24 round-cut diamonds on the microstructure, as well as 46 round-cut diamonds on the bridges of the microstructure and 60 diamonds on the flange, for a total of 6.41 carats

The success of the Golden Bridge Round 39 comes down to one thing: it honours the airy and light character of the baguette movement. Precious stones should serve an exceptional mechanism. And that is exactly the case with the Golden Bridge Round 39, which is the perfect combination of watchmaking and high jewellery.

This is the very first time a complication of this nature has been displayed in such a diminutive piece and is the result of two years of development by Roger Dubuis watchmakers. With its sassy-looking skeleton movements and materials chosen from among the most luxurious and innovative available, the Excalibur Shooting Star timepiece thus offers a perfect

union between Fine Watchmaking technology and natural elegance. Powered by a mechanical skeleton flying tourbillon RD510SQ complete with the prestigious Poinçon de Geneve, the 36 mm Excalibur Shooting Star timepiece represents a galactic new trajectory in the world of skeleton complications. All aglow in 18K pink gold with white round cut diamonds and enamel accents, this 28-piece limited edition comes with "please don't make me choose" options in pink or blue.

If choices really have to be made and pink is your preference, this stunning model offers gleaming white mother-of-pearl décor on the inside. Its retail exclusive blue counterpart features diamond-set lugs and caseband, along with a sophisticated blue sunburst décor on the inside. But why choose? Like Roger Dubuis women, shooting stars are oblivious to the rules.

# Celebrating 125 Years Of The OFFICIANAME A special tribute to history and the unveiling of two new creations



With the invention of the revolutionary 19-ligne "OMEGA" Calibre in 1894, one of watchmaking's most famous names was born. 125 years later, the company has proudly marked the anniversary with an intimate celebration event at its home in Bienne, Switzerland. The occasion was hosted at the OMEGA Museum, where the brand's iconic heritage is displayed. To bring this to life, guests were given an exclusive insight into the OMEGA journey, covering 125 years of key moments, including the story of the brand's name. Before it was called OMEGA, the company's first workshop was opened in 1848 by the young watchmaker Louis Brandt. Almost 50 years later, in 1894, his two sons, Louis-Paul and César, invented a new movement that would change the industry forever. Their innovative 19-ligne calibre introduced pioneering mechanisms as well as industrial-scale production lines. It was so advanced that the brothers named the movement "Omega". Like the last letter of the Greek alphabet, it symbolised ultimate accomplishment and the "final word" in watchmaking success. Following that achievement, the entire company was renamed "OMEGA" in 1903.

Raynald Aeschlimann, President and CEO of OMEGA, welcomed guests to the event and said, "Today, we are truly proud to represent such an iconic name. OMEGA is the only watchmaker to be named after a movement, which proves our commitment to the art of precision. It is also a name renowned in so many areas - from moon landings and the Olympic Games to James Bond films and ocean exploration. This anniversary certainly deserves to be celebrated." OMEGA also gave guests the first glimpse of two new watchmaking creations. The De Ville Trésor 125th Anniversary Edition has been crafted from 18K yellow gold with a burgundy leather strap and a red enamel dial. The caseback includes an anniversary medallion, as well as a decorative engraving known as "damaskeening" - the same style that was originally used on some of the 19-ligne "OMEGA" calibres that were hugely popular in the USA. The second creation revealed at the event was the return of the 19-ligne Calibre – which is being given a new lease of life. The brand has retrieved a number of original movement components from its vaults, including bridges, mainplates, escapements and bimetallic balance spring. These will now be used by the watchmakers in OMEGA's Atelier Tourbillon to recreate 19 movements. This project is also about 21st century evolution, meaning that the 19-ligne calibres will receive distinguished updates and innovations - such as a Swiss hand setting system. Furthermore, the movements will be embellished with "damaskeeing" decoration and will be housed inside a new half hunter pocket watch.



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
